

"I believe that you have to train your own kids yourself." The 22-year track of 9 members of Tora-san's family running a business to make Udon and natural salt. The true shape of families found on a small remote island.

Tora-san is a nickname for Mr. Torao Inuzuka. He earns a living by making Goto Udon, a local specialty noodle and natural salt with his family in Shinkamigoto Town, northern Goto Islands which is about 100 km west of Nagasaki. His wife Masuyo and he have seven children. Every morning, all his children wake up at five and make Udon for about an hour before going to school. It helps family finances, but the parents give them allowances as hourly wages. Tora-san says, "It helps my kids understand the value of money, and responsibility and joy of making things. Through working for the family business, they learn something they can't in the school." It's a 22-year record of a growing family struggling to survive and yet enjoying themselves in a depopulating island.

Won Grand Prix at Fuji Network System Documentary Grand Prize 2015 A TV documentary with a huge reaction was turned into a movie!

In 1993, Masaru Oura, a director of Television Nagasaki visited Shinkamigoto Town on northern Goto Islands. It took him one and a half hours from Nagasaki City by a high-speed vessel. There he interviewed a family, and they introduced the director to Mr. Torao Inuzuka nicknamed Tora-san, running an Udon-making factory. In the same year, Oura made a TV program about Tora-san's family. Empathizing with the way Tora-san lived, Oura has visited the family on weekends and holidays with a digital camera for 22 years, filming the family growing up. As soon as a new TV program about the family went on air in 2015, there was a huge reaction, and it won many awards including the Grand Prix at Fuji Network System Documentary Grand Prize in the same year. The hot TV program portraying the origin of families that modern society is about to forget, with the island's manners, customs, and beautiful nature, was completed as a movie in 2016.
